Scout Safety Minute: Two Deep Leadership

Scouting takes Scout safety seriously. There are several layers of protection to keep Scouts safe while Scouting. The first was outlined in last weeks *Minute*—The Buddy System.

This week we are looking at two deep leadership. No Scout should be one-on-one with an adult, ever—even adults who are registered leaders and Youth Protection Trained. At every Scouting event, our practice is to have at a minimum two adult leaders. If a scout needs to leave the area with an adult, then there needs to be two adults and the Scout needs to be accompanied by their buddy.

By using two-deep leadership, we place an additional layer of protection against child abuse. Only registered leaders and adult caregivers of Scouts may participate in Scouting events.
